'Games' uses active play to creatively teach a Bible story and its concepts. Most classes involve lots of movement and fast-paced activities to engage kids in meaningful ways. It's okay for us to become a little undignified in 'Games' in order to teach the Gospel!

## What to expect:

- Some games may be very active, some may be very calm, some may be physically challenging, some may be intellectually challenging, some may combine any or all styles of games.
- A teaching time where kids circle up and hear a story.
- Scripture reading.
- Application of games to the concepts of the Bible story.
