


## CREATION

- The word "beginning" in Genesis 1:1 is the Hebrew word "re'shiyth (ray-sheeth)" which means "first, beginning, best, chief."
  - THE CREATION STORY WAS BOTH FIRST IN TIMELINE ORDER AND FIRST IN IMPORTANCE IN THE BIBLICAL NARRATIVE.
- AFTER CREATION, GOD SAW THAT HIS CREATION WAS GOOD. HE TRUSTED THE STORY.
- THE CREATION NARRATIVE IS WELL-CONSTRUCTED ORDER OF EVENTS IN 2 GROUPS OF 3 (PLUS A DAY OF REST AT THE END).
  - Day 1: creation of light
    - DAY 2: CREATION OF WATER AND SKY
      - DAY 3: CREATION OF LAND AND PLANTS
  - Day 4: Creation of sun, moon, and stars (givers of light)
    - Day 5: Creation of Birds and Fish (inhabitants of water and sky
      - Day 5: Creation of Land Animals and People (Inhabitants of Land)
- God saved a special designation for his crowned jewel of creation, humanity: we were made in his image.
  - When the Bible mentions we are made in God's image, all we knew about God is that he is eternal (Genesis 1:1), he is a plurality (Genesis 1:26), and he is a creator (Genesis 1).
    - WE ARE ETERNAL BEINGS, WE ARE A PLURALITY (BODY, MIND, SPIRIT), AND WE ARE CREATORS.
- What part of Creation do you see that makes you immediately think. "I trust the goodness of God's Story"?



## The Fall of Humanity

- The word "beginning" in Genesis 1:1 is the Hebrew word "re'shiyth (ray-sheeth')" which means "first, beginning, best, chief."
  - THE CREATION STORY WAS BOTH FIRST IN TIMELINE ORDER AND FIRST IN IMPORTANCE IN THE BIBLICAL NARRATIVE.
- After Creation, God saw that his creation was good. He trusted the story.
- Adam and Eve were the first humans and the only part of creation made "imago dei" or "in the image of God."
- Adam was made first, and his lack of companionship shows how greatly we need community.
- Eve was made from Adam, showing Adam's and Eve's mutual dependence on each other.
- Adam and Eve had one rule: don't eat the fruit from the forbidden tree.
- Adam and Eve failed to trust the story and the goodness of God and ate the fruit from the tree.
- The real sin of Adam and Eve was pride.
  - The serpent told them they would be like God.
  - Adam and Eve wanted to be great like God.
    - IRONICALLY, ADAM AND EVE TRULY DID DISCOVER THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN GOOD AND EVIL. THEY HAD PREVIOUSLY BEEN NAIVE TO EVIL.
- Even though Adam and Eve didn't trust the goodness of the story of God, it didn't end when they messed it up.
- This sparked a new chapter in God's story in which God continuously works to reunite himself with the crowned jewel of his Creation.
- The real punishment for Adam and Eve was not banishment or death
  It was separation from God.
  - One day we will again be in perfect community with God.
